FVRCP	Leukemia	Rabies
<p>For protection against rhinotracheitis, calicivirus, and panleukopenia. Vaccine is given every year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rhinotracheitis is triggered by the common feline herpes virus. Symptoms include sneezing, a runny nose, drooling, crusty eyes, may be sleeping more, and eat less than normal. Left untreated the disease can cause dehydration, starvation, and eventually death. • Calicivirus symptoms include those that affect respiratory and ulcers in the mouth. Left untreated can result in pneumonia; kittens and seniors are especially vulnerable. • Panleukopenia is also known as feline distemper and is easily spread to other cats. Symptoms include fever, vomiting, and bloody diarrhea. Disease progresses rapidly and requires immediate treatment. Without intervention, the cat can die within 12 hours of contracting disease. 	<p>For protection against leukemia virus. Will not treat an already infected cat. Always recommended to any pet who is coming in contact with outdoor cats or foster pets with unknown history. Vaccine is given every year.</p>	<p>For protection against rabies virus. Legally required in State of Tennessee.</p>
